Realising Opportunities Access to Professions

Realising Opportunities (RO) offers your organisation the opportunity to engage with some of the country's most able 16–19 year olds as they take part in a comprehensive programme which develops their skills and ability to progress to a research intensive university.

RO students are amongst the most able students in their age group, but are less likely to have familial, friendship or school-organised access to professions and related opportunities. Through the Access to Professions strand of the programme, RO works to provide enhanced access to information about professions and employability skills.

We aim to work with leading UK and international employers to ensure that the guidance given to our students is up-to-date, dynamic and relevant and offers rewarding professional volunteering opportunities that are easily tailored to demanding careers

Realising Opportunities (RO) is an unprecedented collaboration promoting fair access to higher education and encouraging social mobility for able students from under-represented groups. For the first time, a group of leading research intensive universities have come together to develop a single programme for Year 12 and 13 students (aged 16–19) building upon their collective expertise in widening access to higher education. RO recognises the importance of ensuring that these students have access to information and guidance about careers and employability skills from professionals in the field who can give a true insight into their chosen career.

The Realising Opportunities Programme:

Through RO students take part in an extensive programme of support, information, events and activities. Successful completion results in students having their achievements recognised when applying through UCAS to any of the participating universities. This recognition, and the support that the programme offers, sets Realising Opportunities apart from any other widening participation initiative.

The programme involves:

- A launch event to get students started on the programme.
- Skills development through an online study skills module.
- Ementoring with an undergraduate from an RO University.
- A National Student Conference.
- An assessed academic element to allow students to demonstrate their potential.
- University events, including summer schools, masterclasses and Open Days.
- Access to careers information from professionals in the field.

How can you/your organisation become involved?

Realising Opportunities offers simple yet effective ways for organisations to become involved. The only cost to your organisation is staff time. Our opportunities are flexible to ensure that organisations control how they get involved and how much time they commit.

Our opportunities include:

Ask the Expert

There's no substitute for getting an expert's view and who better to ask about a profession than someone currently doing the job! Via the secure RO ementoring portal, students can view a professional's profile and ask questions. Questions are collated by the RO Central Team and forwarded in a batch so the expert can respond.

To contribute you would need:

- To provide a short biography appropriate for our audience of 16–19 year olds.
- Some time to answer our students' questions (the number of questions to be answered can be agreed in advance).

It was a pleasure to be an 'expert' for the Ask the Expert feature. Equal chances for all regardless of social background is very important to me and I am keen to help wherever I can.
